It was use descriptive text. Researcher was applied Pre- Experimental Research. It aimed at to find out the effectiveness of using Make a Match to improve the students' reading comprehension at the second grade students' of SMPN 1 Takalar 2022/2023. The sample of this research was the students of VIII. 1 class of SMPN 1 Takalar. This research was used purposive sampling technique. The researcher obtained the data using pre-test dan post-test. The mean score of the pre-test was 45,88 and post-test was 80,88. That was better increase of the mean score by students' at the post-test. The test's outcome indicated a 3.273>2.036 significant difference between the t-test and t-table, indicating that the t-table was smaller than the t-test. That was proved by the t-table value 2.036 which was smaller than t-test 3.273. 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INTRODUCTION

According to Yusuf and Enesi in Putri (2021) reading is a key skill for students. Without reading the text, students cannot get function efficiently ad successfully in the world. From reading, the students learn anything about what should they know. Reading is an effective way to learn foreign languages, and it takes the leading part in successful language learning because reading can help the students to develop the other skill and subskill. Therefore, it is important not only to master English, but also to improve the

reading comprehension that students must achieve in order to collect information from English textbooks.

Reading comprehension is a significant thing in reading skills. Within the reading comprehension, the readers will get the suitable information from the text that has been read. Then, to build comprehension, the reader should master the aspects that will help the reader to build a good comprehension in reading. Therefore, to improve students' reading comprehension, the teacher should consider whether the reading text that students read is related to the knowledge and abilities possessed by students.

According to preliminary findings from speaking with the teacher, students struggle with reading and learning English, and some of them don't know the definitions of difficult words because those concepts are unfamiliar to them. This makes it difficult for them to understand the book's content better.

Because students have the chance to engage with one another, learning in the classroom may be turned into a game, and there is rivalry between groups to solve challenges pertaining to the subject matter, using the Make a Match strategy can boost reading comprehension. The use of the Make a Match technique can help boost students' cognitive and physical learning activity. Researchers applied pre-experimental studies. Researchers analyzed the data using a quantitative design. Researchers performed a group pretest-posttest design. The sample was selected using a targeted sampling method and the sample consisted of 34 students from class VIII.1. This instrument was used as a reading test starting with pretest, treatment, and posttest. Researchers used SPSS 26 to analyze the data.

Post-test results reviewed by improving student reading comprehension. Researchers used reading comprehension tests to gather quantitative information about real-world targets. The nature of the test is that 20 numbers match some words. In this case, researchers used the test as a tool to determine a student's ability to comprehend the material. In reading comprehension tests, researchers isolated individual sentences. The purpose of this exercise is to help students search for partners based on the text they receive, find matching text and continue the text. And the whole test consists of 20 numbers.

RESULT AND DISCUSSION

In the post-test, 6 (18%) of the students received excellent scores, 4 (12%) received very good scores, 2 (6%) received good scores, 22 (64%) received fairly good scores, and there were no students who received fair, poor, or very poor scores. It indicates that the student's reading comprehension was improved by applying the Make a Match strategy.

DISCUSSION

Learning that great state enjoyment and innovative nuances in space are indeed necessary for students to grow and

develop properly. Supported by Khairunnisa (2019), the result of her study that using the Make-a-Match technique makes the learning process active and fun.

The Make-a-Match technique is a good technique to use in the classroom when learning to read in 2nd grade at SMPN 1 Takalar. The results of this study show that this technique improves students' reading comprehension. The Make - a - Match technique is a technique developed to help students solve problems. It can stimulate students' interest to learn more and improve their reading comprehension. Supported by Mardiana (2018), their research found that using the make-a-match technique, performance was influenced by student attitudes, and students were motivated by demonstrating enthusiasm and participation.

The make-a-match technique has been proven to significantly increase children' reading comprehension (see Table 2). This was demonstrated by the experimental group's pre-test total score of 1560, with a mean score of 45.88, and post-test total score of 2750, with a mean score of 80.88. The t-test result (3.2732.036) was better than the t-table result. Researchers came to the conclusion that reading instructions while employing the make-a-match technique was successful. The outcomes of data analysis using a t-table and a t-test (22.036) demonstrated this (3.273).

In conclusion, the rationale for this is provided by the study's findings, which showed that experimental teaching using the Make-a-Match technique increased student scores after treatment. Making matches while teaching reading to pupils would undoubtedly help them develop their skills. Applying make-a-match strategies is crucial when instructing reading comprehension, the researcher claimed. This is corroborated by Arroyani's (2019) research, which demonstrates that applying the make-a-match strategy improves kids' reading skills and has a significant positive impact. shows that the enhances students' ability to understand what they are reading.

CONCLUSION

The researcher came to the conclusion that the make a match strategy was more effective than the old technique because it increased students' reading comprehension based on the analysis of the data, study findings, and discussion in the preceding chapter. Before implementing the make a match method, students' reading comprehension of descriptive texts was extremely low. This was distinct from the kids' capacity to comprehend literature after using the make-a-match method.

This leads us to the conclusion that the student's major scores are improving, moving from extremely low to somewhat good. The null hypothesis (H0) was rejected, and make a match was successful in improving the student's reading comprehension of SMPN 1 Takalar, as shown by the test value of 3.273 and the test table of 2.036.

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
